### Context and Rationale

Ethiopia continues to face a complex humanitarian crisis driven by conflict, displacement, climate-related shocks, drought, and localized flooding. Humanitarian operations have expanded significantly across multiple regions, including Amhara, Tigray, Afar, Oromia, Somali, and Southern Ethiopia. The scale and complexity of the response have generated growing demands for timely, accurate, and actionable information to support operational decision-making, logistics coordination, access monitoring, and prioritization of humanitarian assistance. Persistent information management gaps and increasing operational requirements prompted WFP and the Logistics Cluster to request dedicated surge information management capacity through the Standby Partnership Programme.

### Project Overview

Through this six-month deployment, iMMAP provides an Information Management Officer to support the WFP Logistics Cluster in Ethiopia. Based in Addis Ababa, the deployee strengthens information management systems, data collection and analysis, GIS and mapping products, reporting frameworks, and operational coordination mechanisms supporting humanitarian logistics operations nationwide. The assignment focuses on enhancing situational awareness, supporting evidence-based decision-making, improving data integration and visualization, and building sustainable information management capacity within the Logistics Cluster team through mentoring, training, and knowledge transfer.

### Expected Outcomes

- Contribute to more effective humanitarian logistics coordination, improved situational awareness, stronger operational decision-making, and a more resilient information management function capable of supporting large-scale emergency responses across Ethiopia;
- Strengthen information management systems and operational reporting for humanitarian logistics coordination across Ethiopia;
- Improve data collection, validation, analysis, and dissemination to support logistics planning and emergency response decision-making;
- Increase capacity of national and cluster partners through training, mentoring, documentation, and knowledge transfer.
